- Ana Homayoun Ana is an academic advisor and early career development expert, Executive
 Director of Luminaria Learning Solutions, as well as the author of four books, including Erasing
 the Finish Line: The New Blueprint for Student Success Beyond Grades and College Admission, a
 fresh perspective on how to support personal and professional development among future
 generations.
- Jennifer Breheny Wallace <u>Jennifer</u> is co-founder of the Mattering Movement, an award-winning journalist, and the author of the *New York Times* bestselling book *Never Enough:* When Achievement Culture Becomes Toxic – and What We Can Do About It, a close examination

- of the intersection of the drive to optimize performance and the rise in issues such as depression among America's youth.
- Elisa Villanueva Beard Elisa is the CEO of Teach for America. Having served with the organization for 25 years, she will step down in 2025. During her tenure, she has guided its increase in new corps members in the classroom and worked in more than 300 communities.
- Mychal Threets Mychal is a librarian and literacy ambassador who has amassed a large social media following for his videos celebrating library joy and the power of libraries as inclusive community spaces.
- Allison Matthews Allison is head of <u>Minecraft Education at Microsoft</u>, leading a team in producing the game inspired by Mojang Studio's mission to build a better world through the power of play.
- **Susanna Pollack** Susanna is the president of <u>Games for Change</u>, the leading global advocate for the power of games as drivers of social impact.
- Jose Antonio Tijerino Jose is <u>president and CEO of the Hispanic Heritage Foundation</u>, a national nonprofit focused on education, workforce, social impact, and culture through innovative leadership.
