Neuroscientist, Writer, and Entrepreneur Anne-Laure Le Cunff to Deliver Opening Keynote at SXSW EDU 2025

The Founder and CEO of Ness Labs joins the growing lineup alongside New York Times best-selling author Sharon McMahon, who will lead a Featured Session on bridge-building in divided times.

Annual Crossover Day schedule is released.

January 15, 2025 // Austin, Texas – Neuroscientist at King's College London and author of the widely popular Ness Labs newsletter, Anne-Laure Le Cunff, brings the latest research on how we teach and learn to SXSW EDU[®] 2025 with the opening keynote, <u>Rewiring How We Learn: The Power of an</u> <u>Experimental Mindset</u>. Announced today by SXSW EDU, Le Cunff's session will dive into how we can work with our brain's natural learning mechanisms to foster growth, curiosity, and confidence in learning.

With 100,000 readers subscribed to the Ness Labs newsletter, a learning community she launched in 2019, and over 90,000 followers across social media, Le Cunff has built a strong reputation as a go-to source for examining the science and methods behind encouraging achievement without sacrificing mental health. In conjunction with the release of her new book, *Tiny Experiments: How to Live Freely in a Goal-Obsessed World*, Le Cunff will deliver an opening keynote address on **Monday, March 3** that offers insights from her extensive research and examines the role that uncertainty plays in our growth as life-long learners.

"We are very excited to have Anne-Laure kickstart SXSW EDU 2025. Her focus on the neuroscience behind how our brains learn differently is both a reflection of SXSW EDU's 15-year history exploring what shapes teaching and learning practices and our invested interest in continuously pushing their improvement," said **Greg Rosenbaum**, vice president of SXSW EDU. "Her emphasis on how teaching and learning connect to other aspects of our lives, such as mental health, also sets the tone for the rest of the 2025 conference and festival as we journey through the range of topics, societal connections, trends, and industries that are influenced by education."

Also joining the 2025 lineup is **Sharon McMahon**. Coined "America's Government Teacher," the best-selling author, host of the podcast *Here's Where It Gets Interesting*, and voice behind The Preamble newsletter will lead the Featured Session, <u>Learning How to Work with Your Enemies</u>. Particularly relevant in today's polarized political landscape, McMahon will discuss how we can instill ways to

communicate across divides both in and outside of the classroom and the long-lasting effects those skills can have on our larger communities and connections.

In addition to these new Keynote and Featured Sessions, SXSW EDU is proud to unveil initial programming for its 2025 **Crossover Day** on **Thursday, March 6**. Introduced during last year's conference and festival and designed as a convergence of SXSW EDU and SXSW, Crossover Day is open to all EDU registrants as well as all SXSW registrants. - <u>Responsible AI: Balancing Innovation, Impact, & Ethics</u>: Amelia Kelly, chief technology officer at SoapBox Labs; Latha Ramanan, senior vice president of AI product growth and strategic AI initiatives at Merlyn Mind; and Isabelle Hau, executive director of the Stanford Accelerator for Learning, dissect how educators, technologists, and policymakers can collaborate to foster AI literacy among students and ensure the promise of AI can be realized responsibly.
- <u>Connecting Communities: SXSW & SXSW EDU</u>: Representatives and supporters of SXSW EDU and SXSW, including Alexandra Casolaro, director of credential sales for SXSW; Jay Boisseau, executive director of the Austin Forum on Technology & Society; Rakeda Ervin, director of community education at Austin Film Society; and Julia Shatilo, programming director at SXSW EDU, host a special Meet Up that invites all who want to share their passion for the community, tips and tricks for navigating the annual events, and more.

president of SXSW EDU, reviewing the latest trends at the intersection of futurism, education, and technology coming out of the 15th annual SXSW EDU Conference & Festival.
